In this edition of **Cc: News** we've put our two new Staff Team members under the glare of intense questioning from **Richard Workman** to find out what really makes **Matt Merriam** and **Rose Miles** tick. Here are their answers!

First up is **Matt Merriam** our new **Community Church Worker**.

Hi MATT, WE'RE AWARE YOU USED TO LIVE IN YEovil, NOW YOU'RE MOVING TO WORK IN WOODBURY, WHAT HAVE YOU BEEN DOING IN BETWEEN TIMES?

Short answer: we were still living in Yeovil until a few weeks ago but now we've moved into our new home in Brixington, Exmouth.

After a fairly long season of helping people in our church find another church, we officially closed last December. Then we took some time out to have a family adventure, seek refreshment, and listen to God for a few months, travelling to USA and Germany.

For the last four months since returning from travelling, I have been continuing my work with SWYM, preaching most Sundays somewhere, and providing training for churches and charities in mental health.

HOW DID YOU MEET CLAIRE? AND HOW LONG HAVE YOU BEEN MARRIED?

We are one of the many couples who met in SWYM! Claire was a SWYM trainee in Hemyock and Uffculme at the time and I was in Paignton.

We married a few years later in 2006 and then went on our first adventure together, driving 3,500 miles from Seattle, WA to Buffalo, NY in the States.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FAMILY

My wife **Claire** is a gifted pianist who loves being around and blessing people. Our daughter **Annabelle** (9) is an avid reader and has recently fallen in love with cricket. Our second daughter, **Sophie** (8), is a passionate creative who loves stage and gymnastics. Lastly, our son **Elijah** (5) is obsessed with football and loves walking around the house strumming his ukulele and singing. We all love a good adventure and scrambling up rocks.



WHERE DID YOU GROW UP?

In a small town outside the city of Buffalo in New York State, not far from Niagara Falls and the Canadian border. My parents still live in the house they moved to when I was two years old.

YOU'RE HAVING SOME FRIENDS AROUND FOR A MEAL, WHAT AMERICAN DISH



WOULD YOU SERVE TO IMPRESS THEM.

I have a pretty good technique for cooking a good steak if that counts. That being said, I would much rather cook a great curry or roast something tasty than produce an American meal.

IF YOU COULD INVITE THREE OLD TESTAMENT CHARACTERS TO LUNCH WHO WOULD YOU CHOOSE AND WHY?

I would start with Jethro, Moses' father-in-law. Partly because it means lunch could include bacon and also because I buy into a theory that he, even as a Midianite, probably taught Moses who Yahweh was before his burning bush experience and that intrigues me.

Next I would say Eve. Again, partly hoping for something with ham and cheese, but also to hear what paradise and equality actually looked like.

My final choice is Daniel. So much of the New Testament's view of Jesus is filtered through Daniel and his visions, it would be amazing to hear his perspective firsthand.

RANK THE FOLLOWING IN ORDER OF PREFERENCE - AMERICAN FOOTBALL, SOCCER, CRICKET, RUGBY, BASEBALL, BASKETBALL.

This list is incomplete! I am, and have always been, a big fan of ice hockey; so that needs to be top of the list. Football is next (I'm not American enough to call it soccer), then probably basketball which I played competitively for many years. I really enjoy watching rugby (someone please take me to see Exeter Chiefs!), so that is next, then baseball because playing catch with a ball and glove is

one of the most relaxing things. American football and cricket finish off the list respectively.

HOW DID YOU BECOME A CHRISTIAN?

The simple answer is the grace of God birthing faith in me. Similar to all relationships, mine with Jesus has been, and is, a journey. I grew up in a Christian home and culture, so had read the Bible by the time I was about 8 and spoke with God daily. I was baptised very young, mainly because I was so persistent in asking my parents and my church leaders eventually gave in. However it wasn't until I was about 14 that my relationship with Jesus jumped into a new level. At a camp God powerfully spoke to me about his love for me and the place in his family he had chosen me for, despite all the wrong he knew I had done and would still do. It was then that I really knew the rest of my life would be God's.

HOW DO YOU UNWIND?

I really enjoy walking in forests, particularly ones that haven't been walked in much before (or at least feel like it) and that have a good stream/waterfall. When that isn't available, a good television series or book will do.

WHAT BOOK ARE YOU CURRENTLY READING?

"Heart Fire" by Johannes Hartl, the founder of the Augsburg House of Prayer; "The Church as Movement" by JR Woodward and Dan White, Jr; "Character Strengths" by Ryan Neimic; and "Leaving Church" by Barbara Brown Taylor (audiobook). I am rarely only reading one book at a time, but usually have 2 or 3 different



books on the go.

WHICH PERSON HAS BEEN THE GREATEST INFLUENCE ON YOUR LIFE?

Two people come to mind actually. The theologian NT Wright has influenced me massively in my view of the world, Jesus, and this life we live; and I continue to be a big fan of his writings.

Secondly, a young woman that I have supported through mental illness for the last seven years is another big influence, journeying with her birthed a passion for mental health and a theology of suffering that continues to grow and shape me.

SIMILARLY, WHICH BOOK (APART FROM THE BIBLE) HAS BEEN THE GREATEST INFLUENCE ON YOU?

That is a tricky question as I believe change happens in waves, and the small waves often have a much longer-lasting impact than we realise. It is also hard because there are so many books to choose from! However, if I had to choose I would probably pick "Revelation for Everyone" by Wright. It gave language for an inner wrestling around theology and suffering that drastically changed the way I see pain and our journeys through life.

WHAT'S THE BEST WAY TO START THE DAY?

Darkness outside and a crackling fire inside, with a cup of tea, my Bible and time to be mindful of God's Presence and his voice.

WHEN HAVE YOU BEEN MOST FRIGHTENED?

On our honeymoon adventure we took a train to the top of Pike's Peak in the Colorado Rocky Mountains. However, my heart did not like the

altitude change and I genuinely wondered if I would die as I was barely able to lift myself away from hugging the ground.

WHAT'S YOUR FAVOURITE BIBLE VERSE?

That too is an impossible question and changes every few years. Exodus 20:21 is important for me at the moment. Psalm 126 and 1 Corinthians 15:58 have been key for me the last few years.

I am looking forward to this new season bringing some new favourites to add to the list.

Next to face interrogation is **Rose Miles our new Youth Worker.**



HI ROSE, WE'RE REALLY PLEASED THAT YOU ARE JOINING CCW, WHAT HAVE YOU BEEN DOING OVER THE LAST 12 MONTHS?

Thank you, so am I! This year I have been living in Yeovil doing my final year of my Applied Theology degree with Moorlands College and working at Yeovil Community Church as a part of their Create team. So, it's been lots of running youth groups, writing essays, and working out what was next!

WHERE IS YOUR HOMETOWN?

I grew up in Montacute which is a small country village outside of Yeovil. You might know it if you're a fan of period dramas as they have film crews up at Montacute House every so often. For the last three



years I've been living in Yeovil while I've done my degree and have been working at YCC. So really, I've always been a Somerset girl!

TELL US ABOUT YOUR FAMILY?

My family still live in the house I grew up in in Montacute. My dad has just retired from teaching secondary after 36 years and is looking for what's next. My mum works as a creative tutor for adults with learning disabilities. My brother Harry has just finished his A Levels and is hoping to start an apprenticeship in software engineering in September. So, it's a year of lots of change for my family with my dad's career change, Harry starting work, and my moving out of the area.

HOW DID YOU BECOME A CHRISTIAN?

I've always known God on some level as my parents are both Christians and encouraged us to know him from a young age. However, I became a Christian when I was 8 years old after attending an Ishmael kids' event and inviting Jesus into my life. My faith and relationship with God really developed as a teenager when I was able to own my faith for myself and put it into practice.

WHAT DIFFERENCE DOES IT MAKE TO YOU BEING A CHRISTIAN?

Knowing God impacts every part of my life, it means I get to have a relationship with the creator of everything, who knows me completely and is always with me. He inspires and guides my life and gives me the strength and giftings that I need in order to join in with what he is already doing in the world, and in peoples lives.

IF YOU WERE INVITED TO SOMEONE'S FOR DINNER (SMALL HINT HERE...) WHAT FOOD WOULD YOU MOST ENJOY?

Good question, I'm happy with most things really. I love pasta, roasts, pizza, BBQs, etc.

Pizza, Chinese, Indian, Thai, lettuce leaf, then kebab.

WHAT'S THE HARDEST THING YOU'VE EVER DONE?

I think attempting to maintain a social life while doing my placement and my degree is pretty up there!

WHAT STORY DOES YOUR FAMILY ALWAYS TELL ABOUT YOU?

Honestly the story of my birth tends to be the one which is most regularly, and graphically told. It doesn't exactly encourage me to have children any time soon!

WHAT'S YOUR PERFECT DAY LOOK LIKE?

As its summer, probably a day spent on the beach with friends. I'm thinking swimming, playing games, exploring a bit, sunbathing, just enjoying spending time together. Then maybe going back to someone's house to watch a good movie, and probably end up chatting 'till late!

WHAT'S YOUR MOST MEMORABLE HOLIDAY?

I have lots of great memories of going on holiday with family friend's, bodyboarding and kayaking in Cornwall. These consisted of lots of days on the beach when it was sunny (and sometimes not) or huddled up watching movies in the holiday homes if the weather was even too



bad for our parents. Which now I think of it sounds very similar to my perfect day!

IF YOU COULD TRAVEL ANYWHERE, WHERE WOULD YOU GO AND WHY?

New Zealand because its not only totally stunning, but also is home to hobbits so how could I not?!

IF YOU COULD CHOOSE TO WITNESS ONE EVENT FROM THE BIBLE WHAT WOULD IT BE AND WHY?

I would want to witness creation - the beginning of everything, the planets, life on earth etc would be the most incredible thing. Plus being around before the fall would be pretty amazing too.

CARE FOR THE FAMILY



Linda & Jennie

No, not the well know organisation founded by Rob Parsons, but caring for our church family here at Christ Church (CCW).

CCW is a caring church for those both within the Church fellowship and for those people who we know are in need of help and support but who are not directly connected to the Church. As committed Christians, caring should be high up on the agenda of every one of us individually. This having been said, there are two groups within the fellowship who have specific interest in caring for others.

The first are the **House Groups**. Being in a smaller, more intimate group within the Church allows people to make their needs known, or at least for those needs to be picked up more readily within the Group. House group leaders have a responsibility for the care of those in their group.

Then there is the **Pastoral Care Team (PCT)** led by **Linda Collins** assisted by **Jennie Cox**.

When contact is made via the PCT email address (see below), only Linda and Jennie have access to this and they will decide how to proceed.

Confidentiality is key to the work of the team and it is not always necessary or right for personal information to be divulged. The PCT has a responsibility to ensure that pastoral care is carried out within the Church, but will not necessarily be involved in each and every situation.

So, what specifically does the PCT offer? These are the main areas:

- ◆ **Welcoming/hosting:** on a Sunday morning; connecting with newcomers
- ◆ **Cards:** get well, bereavement, birth congratulations
- ◆ **Prayer:** at church or in people's homes as necessary
- ◆ **Home visits:** for those who are ill, lonely or in need of a friendly face
- ◆ **Meals:** following birth or illness
- ◆ **Counsel:** not professional but offering a listening ear
- ◆ **Communion:** Pastoral Team or signpost to Leadership if requested
- ◆ **Lifts:** for hospital visits or to church as necessary
- ◆ **Bereavement:** help and support
- ◆ **Welcome meal:** for those 'new' to the Church

'Breaking the cycle of Poverty through Education'

When nine people from CCW came back from a 10-day visit in February to Kibera working alongside local Kenyan charity **'Swahiba Networks'**, they realised their involvement needed to continue. 'Swahiba' means 'close friend' in Swahili and whilst CCW has been supporting their work for a number of years through our involvement with **Peter Abungu**, the team felt it was time for a new independent charity to be known as **Hope4Kibera** to be launched with wider community support.



The Kibera slum in Nairobi, Kenya, is the largest urban slum in Africa and home to about a million people living in dire poverty. 3 metre square tin shacks are stacked together on a hillside of rubbish and worse. Families fight the daily battle for survival against all the diseases of poverty: malnutrition, TB, HIV, indiscriminate violence and more. The lucky ones get one basic meal a day.

The only way out of the slum is to obtain a School Leaving Certificate, which at least gives a chance of a survivable income. Swahiba Networks support children of secondary school age, and their families, to give the best possible chance of them completing school. By providing practical health support, mentoring, empowerment classes, especially for girls, income generating training and some access to apprenticeships, young people are helped giving them hope for their futures.

Swahiba have a vision to open a **free school** for these children as many families can't afford food and clothing let alone schools fees. They have already raised the money for the school and built it.


But, they do not, as yet, have the funds to open the school and run it.

Hope4Kibera is in the process of obtaining UK charitable status and a website - www.hope4kibera.org - will soon be up and running and will contain more information.

In addition, a separate fund - **The John Wynne Poor Fund** - has been set up to help with emergency health care and food provision which will be administered in conjunction with **Hope4Kibera**.

You are invited to the Launch Evening

Chris Omondi, who grew up in the Kibera slum, and who is the driving force behind the school is visiting Woodbury in September. The official public



launch of **Hope4Kibera** is on **Sunday 22nd September** here at Christ Church commencing at 7.00pm. Everyone is very welcome and the event is being advertised in the local community.

Come along, hear Chris' amazing story, see presentations on Kibera and find out more about the charity, and have some cheese and wine!

ABIDE ROOTED CAMP

When we left Kibera in February we said we'd be back and a small window of opportunity enabled us to join the **Abide Rooted Camp 2019**. Swahiba start planning for the camp in May with complete faith that donations will be received to cover the £50 needed for each camper to attend.



We were part of a team of 30 Kenyans, 15 Ugandans who had come to see how the camp was run and us 2 Brits to serve the **120 young people** aged 14-20 years who had been invited from the slums to have a life changing week in the Lukenya Hills. These young people have never left the slums so to see their faces as they arrived was quite something! The week was not that different from a camp in the UK -

sleeping under canvas, great food, speakers, worship, games, activities, smelly toilets and a shower apart from the hyenas roaming the campsite at night in search of food!!

We were there to do whatever was needed and found ourselves making sandwiches, serving food, making signs, cleaning pots, welcoming speakers, washing down chairs, helping with arts/crafts, judging competitions, setting a treasure hunt, helping with small groups and generally encouraging the team whilst getting to know them on a deeper level. When you have a conversation with any young person - their dreams and passion all hinge on whether they can get enough money to pay for their education yet they are so thankful for what God is doing in their lives.



Many young lives were touched during the week - first time commitments and re-dedications that will be followed up by the team to ensure these young people are connected to a church back in Kibera. Although the





'grannies' of the camp we felt completely humbled to be part of the fantastic work that Swahiba do and see the difference they are making on a daily basis.

We could say so much about the week but come and hear first hand from **Peter Abungu & Chris Omondi** when they visit Christ Church on Sunday Sept 22nd and share a little of their story during the

morning service and help to launch Hope4Kibera in the evening at 7.00pm.

Chris Omondi will also be sharing his story at **Kids Café** on Thursday 26th September and at **Gems** on Friday 27th September.



WOODBURY 10K FUN RUN Sunday 20th October 2019

MISSION FOCUS - VARSHA

VARSHA was just six years old when she came to the attention of **CHILD'S Trust**. Her father had died from TB and her mother died when she fell out of a tree whilst collecting leaves for a meal for Varsha and her two brothers. The children went to live with grandparents, but they were unable (or didn't want) to look after Varsha. She was now an orphan with nowhere to go!

CHILD'S Trust is a small mission project in India, set up by **Mark & Julie Thomas**. Mark has a business interest in India and whilst visiting Delhi 20 years ago with Julie, she was handed a baby. The mother wanted her to take the baby and look after it because she had no money to raise her. Realising the tremendous problem in India regarding orphaned and abandoned children, Mark & Julie decided they would do something to help, so CHILD'S Trust was set up. Initially, they sought sponsors here in the UK to support children that are in orphanages. They then supported medical camps in Northern India and it was through one of these camps in 2008 that they came across Varsha, who was six years old.

God's timing is amazing, because Mark & Julie were just finalising plans to set up a new project called '**HOUSES OF HOPE**'. CHILD'S Trust totally supports Indian couples who have two children of their own and who are willing to take in up to 8 children who have no one to care for them. *Viswajyoti* (meaning '*Light of the World*') was the first to be set up and Varsha was the first child to be in this new family. **Mick & Jennie** were asked if they would be prepared to support

Varsha and they have done so now for 11 years. They met her when in India a few years ago. Varsha was baptised last year. She is now 17 and a lovely young lady. What would have become of her if she had not come into that House of Hope?

UNICEF estimated that in 2018 there were 29.6 million abandoned and orphaned children in India. It is a huge problem that the government seems to ignore, but for Varsha and the other children in the Houses of Hope, **there is hope for a bright future.**
